

A SHORT VOLUNTARY

Orlando Gibbons (1583–1625)

Born at Orford, Gibbons became a chorister at King's College, Cambridge, at the age of 12. He was appointed organist of the Chapel Royal in 1605 and Westminster Abbey in 1623. He composed much church music, madrigals, and music for viols and for keyboard and was a distinguished performer on the organ and virginals. He died at Canterbury and is buried in the Cathedral there.
